REPORT OF COMPASSION'S EXECUTIVE PASTOR

I humbly submit this, my twelfth annual report, as a servant of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Thirteen years ago Jesus rescued me, pulled me from the pit, and filled me with His Holy Spirit. Not a day goes by that I don't praise God for His grace, His never-ending love, and His mighty promises. I also reflect often on the critical role our church – Compassion Church of the Nazarene – played in my own life. Without the ministries of our church, the uncompromising message of Christian Holiness, and the faithful leadership and example set by Pastor Stephen, Pastor Mike, and others, I wouldn't be where I am today. 2022-23 was a tremendous year in the life of our church. We have so many things to celebrate and be thankful for. Here are a few of the "high water marks" as I saw them as your Executive Pastor:

- Serving another 1,000 families as part of our Community Christmas Outreach.
- Hands & Hearts Day: Our annual partnership with New Covenant Schools where our food pantry is flooded with 4 th graders who join us in serving and loving our neighbors.
- Retiring an additional \$130,000 in long-term debt. Our debt balance has decreased by over \$1 Million in the past decade.
- REVIVE2022 with Dr. John Bowling. What a powerful and life-changing four days
 we experienced! The Holy Spirit showed up and did a mighty work in our people,
 including me!
- Raising an additional \$50,000 for the Compassion Fund, and the hundreds of families we have been able to bless through it.
- The Revelation Worship Experience. What a powerful night of scripture, worship, and Holy Spirit Power we shared!

Financially we had another strong year. Total giving was \$1.68 Million and total spending was \$1.75 Million. Over \$100,000 of that spending was for our new Children's building and a major overhaul of our upper parking lot (after 45+ years!), from funds we had raised in prior fiscal years. I want to personally thank the outstanding members of our finance committee – Tim John, Mike Walker, Amy Seipp, and Rick Huff. The long hours spent reviewing charts, spreadsheets, trends, facts, and figures are all great investments in expanding God's Kingdom here on earth and helping ensure Compassion is a consistently good steward of all that is entrusted to us.

On a personal note, Soni and I celebrated our 27 th wedding anniversary and I love her more today than ever before! She is a beautiful, strong, faithful woman of God and the best wife to me and mother to our children I could ever ask for. Embry is quickly finishing her 8th grade year and is very active in youth group and volleyball. Callen is in 5th grade and can now solve a Rubik's cube in 60 seconds! I am eternally grateful for the blessing of my wife and children, and the holy love that fills our home. I am privileged to serve the Lord in such a supportive and healthy church community. The constant encouragement and love shown to me and my fellow pastors is beautiful....and appreciated!

REPORT OF COMPASSION'S WORSHIP & TEACHING PASTOR

What a wonderful church! Compassion Church of the Nazarene is some of the most generous, supportive, and encouraging people in the world! I am honored to work with you for the growth of the Kingdom. Thank you for the opportunity; I don't take it for granted. I would like to report that this year has been a great year of ministry.

This year, we have seen some of the most dramatic changes in the two ministries I oversee. The lingering effects of Covid meant that our bible study and small group attendance was struggling. In response, we decided to bring our two service times together to make it easier for people to choose to engage in Sunday morning Bible studies. We also started a number of new small groups and pushed the congregation to engage again in small group ministry. I believe this has been successful!

Our worship team was able to come together as one worship team that leads worship in both services. This has slightly changed the worship style of each of our Sunday services. However, it has enabled greater participation and an increase in new people joining our team. The new schedule for our worship team has certainly come with challenges. However, the reason we changed was to help our congregation engage in Sunday morning Bible studies. Here is a snapshot of what has happened since we made this change and encouraged our congregation to engage in small groups:

- Average attendance in Sunday Bible studies increased from 45 to 125 people
- Number of small groups increased from 15 to 23
- 455 people are now engaged in some kind of small group at Compassion

We have seen some numerical growth in our ministry. However, I believe we have also seen some leadership and spiritual growth. The leaders in these ministries (worship and small group) are incredible and intentional followers of Jesus. Each person on our team approaches their role with excellence while allowing others the space to do things differently. It is such a privilege to be on the same team as these people! While it would be impossible to thank everyone involved (it would take too many pages!), I feel compelled to offer a special note of gratitude to some notable leaders: Brian Marker, Dee Jones, Mikayla Bryan, T.A. Dill, Carroll Sluss, Chris Barber, Andy Scoles, Chris McCown, and Alden Addair. Thank you for working so tirelessly to make our ministries so successful!

Finally, I want to thank my family: Bethany, and our four children, Gracyn, Gavin, Gabriel, and Gia. They are always so ready to support and to serve. I could not do what I do without them doing what they do. My wife, Bethany, in particular is a rock. I am better because I am married to her. Thank you again for the opportunity to serve Compassion Church.

As we quickly approach our 10th year as staff at Compassion and nearly 14 years as part of this church family, the Robertson household is truly grateful for Compassion and the ways in which God has used this church to impact our lives for His Kingdom. We are grateful that our kids have been raised in a church with so much love! Thank you for your many years of generosity and investment in us.

Celebrate Recovery

What a tremendous year for our CR forever family! God has poured out His grace, favor, and blessing on our ministry. We had a year of increase in attendance with an average of 30 weekly participants. We were able to finally split our men's group and create a specific "Chemical Addiction Group" which has been very fruitful. We witnessed a man who overcame Meth addiction maintain his first year of sobriety and now is being trained as a co-leader for our chemical group. We were abundantly thankful for the return of Mrs.Tara Hughes from FL to be our female ministry lead. She also began leading our female Step Study group in January. Both our men's and women's step studies are helping people find healing and wholeness while actively training new leadership. Last, but not least we celebrate the launching of The Landing under the leadership of Pastor Ben Bailey. The Landing is a CR program designed for teens in 6th-12th grade. The Landing team has been very proactive in engaging the community and has been shepherding their flock well during this initial planting phase. We couldn't ask for a better team of leaders who love hurting teens so well!

Connections

What a rich harvest we have come to reap this past year at Compassion! It seemed this year the Covid fog had finally lifted and the vast majority of people returned from exile. God has also been sending us frequent guests from our community. Many of these guests have become engaged, assimilated into groups, and many are now serving in various capacities. This past year alone, we brought in 48 new members into our church through our online and in-person Connection Classes. Our new name of Compassion has continuously drawn in people who are hurting and need the loving care of Jesus. One new couple in our congregation have actively ministered in churches for years and recently moved here from AZ. They declared that this is the friendliest, most welcoming church that they've ever attended! What a testimony to the love of Jesus flowing through our hospitality teams and overall congregation! Thank you for being the church and living out the name of Compassion.

Finally, I want to thank my bride, Jaime who has been my constant companion and partner in ministry for nearly 16 years. Thank you for faithfully serving by my side! I couldn't do it without you! REPORT OF COMPASSION'S PRIME TIMERS & CARE PASTOR

PRIME TIMERS - CHECK US OUT!

There are many who ask what Prime Timers are. Well, this is a great question! At Compassion Church, there is a wonderful group of people that are more mature in age and have a wealth of experience and knowledge! They have garnered a tremendous amount of wisdom and experience that can be applied to all sorts of ministries in the Body of Christ. We need this vast resource to help educate and encourage future generations. What identifies or qualifies a person to be a Prime Timer? Usually, that question is answered by individuals who are drawn into and want to be a part of this awesome group! Age is not so important as compared to the desire to actively connect with the hearts of like-minded people. Our average age is 55 years so that means we have 40-somethings all the way up to 90-somethings. There you have it! If you feel like a prime timer, come join us!

Here are some of the things Prime Timers do:

- We are actively involved in all kinds of volunteer ministries, such as the food pantry to give food to 80-100 families a week! A major majority of our volunteers are Prime Timers who work throughout the week to distribute food.
- Disaster Response We've had a number of prime timers that have traveled to areas
 that have been affected by natural disasters. Our last areas were Kentucky and
 Tennessee floods but we respond whenever the need arises.
- Church lawn care and cleanup Prime Timers play a big role in helping with grounds clean up on the church property throughout the year.
- Outings Trips are planned to go to places of interest such as: Sight and Sound
 Theatre in Lancaster, the Billy Graham Home and Museum in Charlotte, The Cove in
 Asheville, The Bible Museum in Washington, D.C., Case Mountain Railway, etc.
- Gatherings We have many gatherings throughout the year at restaurants in the area as well as three to four banquets centered around seasonal events.
- Worship Opportunities Our praise and worship ministry utilizes Prime Timers in the morning worship as needed.
- Life Groups Many of our Prime Timers are members of Life Groups that meet throughout the week
- Visitation Our Prime Timers often pay visits to the shut-ins and the hospitalized.
 Note writing and card-sending ministries are very important. Some have even made baby blankets, embroidered hats and shawls for ill children.
- Prime Timer Communication If you'd like to receive texts and emails focused on Prime Timer events, prayer requests and needs, please contact the church office.

If you are sensing that the Lord is drawing you to be a part of this dynamic ministry, please know, we are anxious to welcome you to the Prime Time group. Let's be a blessing together!

REPORT OF THE COMPASSIONATE MINISTRIES CENTER COORDINATOR

What an adventure in Compassionate Ministries this last year has been. When our church formally changed its name to Compassion Church of the Nazarene, I began praying that God would give us more opportunities to show compassion to those around us. The Lord answered this prayer in more ways than I can count. Here are a few examples:

- We partnered with Virginia Baptist Hospital to provide infant carseats and pack and plays for new mothers in need. Any mother without a car seat or a safe place to sleep for their baby can call our offices and get one of these items before being discharged from the hospital.
- We successfully delivered 1,000 Christmas boxes across Lynchburg and surrounding communities for the third year in a row. This past year also marked the 14th year of the Christmas box program and continues to meet countless needs during the holidays.
- We launched the Compassion Care Teams, which will use various skills within our congregation to help those in need with work projects, home repairs, and general maintenance that they otherwise wouldn't have the resources to complete.
- We partnered with the Isaiah 117 house, a local nonprofit that helps foster children being brought into care prepare for their opening by providing funding for their teen room, meeting space for their monthly volunteer meetings and awareness for their overall mission.
- We continue to operate our weekly food pantry, feeding anywhere from 60-85 clients on a weekly basis. New volunteers join us each week and we continue to rely on those who have volunteered with us for many years to feed hungry families in Lynchburg.
- We resettled a Ukranian family fleeing the war here in Lynchburg. When I look back on this specific event, I am still amazed at how God orchestrated every piece of this process to bring this family to be near their dearest Ukranian friends already living in Lynchburg. So many people behind the scenes made this happen and it is a career highlight for me. Anton, Maryna and Nataliia have given up so much to reside in a safe place and given the circumstances of them coming to the states, they are all doing incredibly well. It has been such an honor to get to know them and to be a part of a church family who jumped in to serve and love them.

It is a privilege to be a part of meeting tangible needs of people in our church family and our community and to see compassion in action day in and day out. We would not be Compassion Church without the many volunteers who give their time and resources so generously to help those in need. It truly takes a team and my team serves tirelessly to love and serve others.

As always, my family is always willing to step in and serve wherever the need is. They are my biggest encouragers and my biggest blessing. These days with Brandon and my kids are flying by and I am grateful for each one.
