



REPORT OF COMPASSION'S EXECUTIVE PASTOR

I humbly submit this, my fourteenth annual report, as a servant of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Fifteen years ago Jesus rescued me, pulled me from the pit, and filled me with His Holy Spirit. Not a day goes by that I don't praise God for His grace, His neverending love, and His mighty promises. I also reflect often on the critical role our church – Compassion Church of the Nazarene – played in my own life. Without the ministries of our church, the uncompromising message of Christian Holiness, and the faithful leadership and example set by Pastor Stephen, Pastor Mike, and others, I wouldn't be where I am today.

2024-25 was a tremendous year in the life of our church. We have so many things to celebrate and be thankful for. Here are a few of the "high water marks" as I saw them as your Executive Pastor.

- Serving another 1,000 families as part of our Community Christmas Outreach.
- Hands & Hearts Day: Our annual partnership with New Covenant Schools where our food pantry is flooded with 4th graders who join us in serving and loving our neighbors.
- Retiring an additional \$138,000 in long-term debt. Our debt balance has decreased by over \$1.6 Million in the past fifteen years.
- Raising an astounding \$122,000 for the Compassion Fund, and the hundreds of families we have been able to bless through it.
- The completion of the 2nd floor of the Compassion Kids building in August 2024, and the corresponding launch of our pre-teen ministry.

Financially, we had another strong year. We received more than we spent and all bills and budgets were paid in full. I want to personally thank the outstanding members of our finance committee – Tim John, Mike Walker, Kristi Dolan, and Caleb Beasley. The long hours spent reviewing charts, spreadsheets, trends, facts, and figures are all great investments in expanding God's Kingdom here on earth and helping ensure Compassion is a consistently good steward of all that is entrusted to us.

On a personal note, Soni and I celebrated our 29th wedding anniversary and I love her more today than ever before! She is a beautiful, strong, faithful woman of God and the best wife to me and mother to our children I could ever ask for. Embry is quickly finishing her 10th grade year and is very active in youth group and volleyball. Callen is in 7th grade, loves running, and loves Jesus! I am eternally grateful for the blessing of my wife and children and the holy love that fills our home. I am privileged to serve the Lord in such a supportive and healthy church community. Discipleship Ministry Overview

Our Discipleship Ministry continues to be a vital part of our church's mission to Love God, Love Others, and Serve Both. As of this reporting period, we are excited to share that we have 57 active discipleship groups meeting regularly. These groups include a diverse range of formats, such as Bible Studies, Life Groups, Intentional Discipleship groups, and Men's and Women's ministries. In total, over 450 individuals are actively participating in these groups—a testament to the growing hunger for spiritual growth and authentic community within our congregation.

Each group serves as a space for deeper biblical engagement, meaningful relationships, and spiritual accountability. Leaders are continually being trained and supported to foster healthy, multiplying groups. We are encouraged by testimonies of life transformation, deeper prayer lives, and increased outreach efforts happening organically through these discipleship environments.

Worship Ministry Overview

The Worship Ministry has experienced steady growth and increased engagement across all our worship services. Currently, we have a dedicated team of over 50 volunteers who serve regularly on the worship team, including musicians, vocalists, and choir members. Their commitment and excellence are key ingredients to creating worship environments where the presence of God is honored and where our congregation can engage fully in praise.

Together, the Discipleship and Worship Ministries continue to serve as core pillars of our church's mission—Making Christlike disciples in the nations by helping people grow in Love for God, Love for Others, and Service to Both!

Nursery Ministry

The Nursery Ministry has experienced a significant shift towards a more intentional teaching environment. Key highlights include:

As I'm writing this report, I'll soon be wrapping up my 6th year serving in Compassionate Ministries and my 18th year as part of Compassion's staff. I can confidently say that I am so privileged to work my dream job. I get to serve our community on behalf of our church family and lead an incredible team of volunteers who truly embody what it means to Love God, Love Others and Serve Both. Thank you for trusting me with this role. I feel so blessed!

Compassionate Ministries continued to meet the needs of our community and beyond through several avenues this past year. Here are some highlights:

- Our weekly food pantry saw record numbers and our volunteers continued to joyfully
 meet the need of serving hungry families, estimating that each family who shops our
 pantry for groceries leaves with 150 pounds of free food.
- Our Care Team began a renovation in our food pantry to expand our capacity to serve families and the Care Team completed their 53rd project since beginning just over two years ago!
- We provided 23 car seats and pack and plays to moms in need through our partnership with Virginia Baptist Hospital.
- Compassion wrapped up its 16th year of the Christmas Box Outreach, providing 1,000 Christmas dinners to those in need.
- We partnered with Lynchburg City Schools to provide Christmas gifts for every child in their Restorative Academy located at T.C. Miller.
- We continued partnerships with area nonprofits such as Miriam's House, The Blue Ridge Pregnancy Center, Love Heals, FCA, the Isaiah 117 House and more to help meet the needs of our city.
- We dispatched two teams to both Eastern Tennessee and Western North Carolina to help with Hurricane Helene Flood Relief on behalf of Virginia Nazarene Disaster Response.

Personally, we are grateful for all the ways God has sustained our family this past year. Brandon is finishing his twentieth year of teaching high school, Ryne discovered a love for running cross country, Lucy continued to perform in several area theatre productions and Landon played every sport he could while continuing to be best friends with every dog he met.
